AREA VIII TRIVIA

In the early days of AGEHR (1954-1958), the country was divided into nine areas. Area VI consisted of Iowa, Missouri, Kansas, Nebraska, Minnesota, South Dakota, North Dakota and Colorado. The National Board consisted of the elected and appointed officers. In the winter of 1969 – 1970 they were asking Area Chairs to join them to secure input from the grass roots. In 1970 our Chair, Pennie Smith, could not attend, so she asked me as Chair-Elect to attend. The Area Chairs did not meet with the Board but were assigned to another room to realign the areas into eleven areas. After working on all aspects, the group suggested the twelve areas, which we know today. Area VIII consisted of five states: Illinois, Iowa, Kansas, Missouri, and Nebraska. This change required other changes including an Area Chair for each and finances had to be proportionally distributed. Much later, when I was serving as National President, we added the Canadian provinces to the Areas bordering our northern states.

As historian, I was asked to upgrade a list of Area VIII Chairs and festivals. Because I had joined AGEHR in 1962 (as a neophyte), I was not sure of events prior to that. I was able to get in touch with Betty Jo Wilcox, the only one presently in Area VIII who was active in "old" Area VI, to help with those early years. Thanks, Betty Jo.

THE 1960'S (OLD AREA VI)

1960-1962: Frances Keck was in charge of handbells in this area and she had a festival in Des Moines. Betty Jo reported that this was loosely organized and not all choirs were informed about it.

1962-1964: Istvan (Steve) Gladies was Chair and the festival in '64 was held at Iowa State University with some events held at the Collegiate Methodist Church. Betty Jo was Festival Chair. The Fink Family Ringers presented a program. I learned a lot and made many friends. Wendell Wescott's choir was the featured choir.

1964-1966: Betty Jo was the Area Chair and the '66 festival was held in Manhattan, Kansas. The attendance was much great than the previous festival. The fee was \$28.00 per person including the festival, room and board. Marvin Reecher directed two numbers by the massed ensemble.

1966-1968: John Hoyt was Area Chair. The '68 festival was held at the University of Minnesota in Minneapolis, Minnesota with Betty Fletcher as Festival Chair. Richard Litterst conducted the massed ringing. The ballroom had been reserved for massed ringing but the University decided to redecorate the ballroom. Adjustments had to be made quickly. Finances for the Area were not good and expenses were not met. Betty Fletcher borrowed \$100 from National and used \$250 of her personal funds. A guest choir from another state did not ring as well as many of our own choirs. Their technique was not as advanced as most choirs in the nation. One feature was a picnic at Lake Nokomis. There were five concerts by individual choirs.

1968-1970: Pennie Smith was Area Chair. Although the previous Chair had assigned several people to check out future festival sites, nothing was done. I had been asked to see what was available in Lincoln. One and a half years later they called to see if we had a site. They asked me to try again and told me to sign up for whatever was available. (I had 24 hours to do this.) In January 1970, Pennie asked me to be Festival Chair. I accepted because there was no one else except a new director who had just started. I asked him, Russell Blackmer, and Roger Arnold from Omaha to help. They gave me the entire treasury (\$26) to start on. We got Richard Litterst, National President, to direct the massed ringing. Sometimes things work well when you are only given five months to prepare a festival. We had excellent participation and the treasure grew when registrations came in. At the end I paid the bills, repaid the \$100 to National and \$150 to Betty Fletcher, part of what she had spent. Then I turned over \$800 to the Area treasury as the profit. Since then our Areas have been on a firm basis financially. The final concert presented individual choirs as well as massed ringing.


