# Chair's Concept

#### Hello ringers!

You guessed it! This is the BIG ISSUE about the FESTIVAL! All of our articles should be related in one way or another to the Festival this coming summer (June 24-26, 2010) in Topeka, KS. I would like to answer a few questions that have been asked along the way.

• Will it be possible to ring in more than one level? I have ringers who would be best suited for the Tins level, but I also have ringers who would be challenged and would enjoy the Gold level.

YES! Just split your ringers up and have half of them prepare for one level, while the other half prepares for another level. We will work with you to make sure you have enough bells.

• Help! I have never been to a festival and I'm not sure how to proceed with the music!

Take a look at the music selections. If your choir normally rings level 1-2, then you might consider ringing in the Tins or Silver level. If you normally ring level 3-4, you might consider the Gold level. If your choir is a high performance choir, and routinely rings level 4-5, then please join the Bronze level. Also, look at the actual music – choose the music that fits your worship services the best. No matter which level you ring, we ALL ring the massed music. That music has been chosen so that all may participate. Those pieces usually start and end our concert. It is quite thrilling to hear 500 bell ringers ringing the same tune at the same time!

Remember that you are to purchase the music in advance so that you come to the festival to make music, not learn the music. You will need to purchase music for every one or every two (if they share) of your ringers. AGEHR and Area VIII are very strict on copyright laws. No photocopies will be permitted at the festival.

# • Will this be anything like the day-long workshops that have been offered in my state?

Yes, except please multiply that by 3 days and be sure to add the evening activities. The Topeka 2010 Committee has been working hard to make sure you get a real bang for your buck. If you want to ring all day, every day, we have you covered! There will be classes and rehearsals beginning right after breakfast and going into the evening each day. There will be a LARGE handbell store for music and gifts. There will be concerts by our guests, the Columbia Handbell Ensemble (Thursday night), and the Raleigh Ringers (Friday night). There will be concerts by local groups

# **Dinner Bell Recipe**

# Addictive Snack Mix

2 c brown sugar + 2 sticks of butter + 1 c corn syrup. Boil the above ingredients for 5 minutes—no stirring. Add 2 t vanilla + 1 t baking soda.

Pour the above hot mixture over the following: 2 boxes of Ritz peanut butter crackers + 2 boxes of Cheeze Its + 1 bag of pretzels + 2 c or 1 can of peanuts.

Bake at 275° for 45 minutes, stirring every 15 minutes. Then add the following: 1 bag of candy corn + raisins or cranberries, if desired.

Former AGEHR president and Honorary Life member Richard W. Litterst, of Rockford, Illinois, died August 9, 2009. He was 83.

In the very first years of the Guild, Litterst was appointed chair of the Music Committee, a position he held until being elected vice president in 1963. He then served 19 consecutive years on the national board, followed by another two as chair of Area VIII. He received the Honorary Life membership award for his accomplishments and contributions to the art in 1974.

He is well known for his Martin Ringers of Second Congregational Church in Rockford, where he served as minister of music. His choir rang with the traditional English "off-the-table" style on a set of 169 Whitechapel bells, covering more than six octaves. He also conducted the Rockford Pops Orchestra for over 30 years and has served churches in Westfield, New Jersey, Omaha, Nebraska, and Rockford and Freeport, Illinois, as organist, choirmaster, and handbell director. He also taught organ at Rockford College, Rock Valley Junior College, and Beloit College. He even drove buses for the Peoria-Rockford Bus Company between Rockford and O'Hare International Airport in Chicago. Most recently he served as organist for the First Church of Christ, Scientist in Rockford, where he played his last service on July 22.

Though he sought to advance the art musically, Litterst believed that there was room in the art form for handbell ringers at all levels.

Joan Shull, who was instrumental in producing the *Tempo Setters* videos in which Litterst took part, said, "My first festival was in 1969 in Minnesota, where Dick Litterst was the massed conductor, teacher, and president. For years I was so awed by his presence that I avoided getting acquainted! Then we began to work together in Area VIII, and he was a joy to work with! His fantastic Martin Ringers set impossible goals for everyone in those days, and I recall having Dick teach me at one festival how to do triplets with my bell choir."

Ed Rollins recalls, "I believe I first met Dick at the Area VIII festival in Cape Girardeau in 1990 when his choir was the featured choir. I certainly remember his choirs performance...not only was it an excellent presentation, but the unique ringing style was one that brought about much discussion. They rang "backwards" like was first done in England with the Whitechapel bells, and their precision was still astonishing. It was truly something completely different to observe by most in the audience. In addition, they had the huge bass rack, which was, for a bass ringer, very interesting – and they did a great job using it effectively. Dick will be remembered for his many contributions to the handbell world and to AGEHR. He was at the forefront of developing the guild's mission and seeing that it played out. He was passionate about handbells and he spent his life promoting the art. He enjoyed talking about the past, but he certainly had ideas for the future. Conversations with Dick were always interesting and thought provoking. We have lost another giant but heavens bells are ringing better than ever!"



Most of us knew David Davidson as conductor; a few knew him as mentor; everyone knew him as friend; and some knew him as colleague. Knowing David Davidson for the past twenty-five years has been so very meaningful to my music ministry career and my life. David was one of those very few persons who were genuinely concerned about the life of everyone that he met and conducted. Everyone called him "friend." As a mentor, I have learned so much about conducting both choral and handbells, and how to make music even though I did not have a formal class from him. My experiences of learning were at various festivals, seminars, including the summer 2009 Texas Conference Choir Clinic at Lakeview Methodist Conference Center where he was the adult choral clinician. In the mid 1980s I hosted David as clinician for the bell choirs of First United Methodist Church in Ponca City, Oklahoma. That experience of having him work with my bell choirs and having the private tutoring was an amazing time. It was at the height of the Dallas Handbell Ensemble's performing schedule and before David became the conductor of the Dallas Symphony Chorus. His teaching will echo through my groups for as long as I direct. I considered it a privilege to call him colleague, one who is in music ministry for all of the right reasons.

At Texas Conference Choir Clinic this summer we had some time together and he witnessed to the joy of making music with excellence in the church. We concluded our conversation not knowing that we would never meet again and visit. David often spoke how music can change the molecules in a room and the impact that worship music has on the congregation. So now he is in heaven free of his pain, conducting the angelic choirs of singers and ringers. Someday I hope that I too will join with him in the music ministry in heaven, ringing bells and singing in the church eternal!

AGEHR has certainly benefited and been changed by his leadership, his prominence in conducting at festivals, conferences and Distinctly Bronze. At the second Distinctly Bronze, AGEHR and David set in place a conducting intern program. It was my pleasure and honor to have been selected to work with him and those advanced ringers. We will miss his personality, his conducting style, and his "all business" attitude of making music.

# Promenade & Showcass Concerts

Part of the excitement of attending an Area Festival is the opportunity to hear other groups in concert. In addition to the featured choirs, The Columbia Handbell Ensemble and The Raleigh Ringers, there are also the Promenade Concerts and the Showcase Concert. Anyone attending the conference who wishes to share his or her talents may sign up to participate in the Promenade or Showcase Concerts.

The Promenade Concerts take place during class time and are an hour in length. This is an opportunity for a choir, ensemble or soloist to perform a full length concert. (The one hour time slot includes set up, performance and tear down.) There are seven to nine of these concerts scheduled throughout the conference and the concerts are filled on a first-come, first-serve basis. Some choirs like to perform more than once, which is possible if there are not enough groups to fill all nine spots.

The Showcase Concert is an opportunity for groups or individuals to share a one hour time slot. Full choirs, ensembles and soloists are welcome to participate in this concert. There is only one Showcase Concert and every effort will be made to accommodate all who wish to perform.

Registration forms for the Promenade and Showcase Concerts will be included with your registration materials. This is a great opportunity for those who wish to share their talents with other handbell enthusiasts.

The rehearsals would be held during regular class session times.

This track will be titled the **Ad Astra Ensemble** (a Latin phrase meaning "to the stars.") This Latin phrase is also part of the Kansas State motto.

The Ad Astra Ensemble participants will prepare four songs prior to the first rehearsal. There will be an application to return in the January issue of *Quavers*. The application will be asking for your three best ringing positions, handbell compositions you have recently played, recent ensemble experiences and your choir director's name with email address.
