RESOURCES AVAILABLE TO YOU!

It is an honor to be able to write my first *Quavers* article as your Area 8 Chair, and to have as my subject matter the abundant resources available to all of us on the Guild's national website: www.handbellmusicians.org. I'm intimately familiar with some of these resources as I use the website often in my work on your board. I also serve on a Resource Task Force in the area of Education. The first thing that completely blows my mind is the **amazing** user interface with the "online book" version of these resources! You can turn the page with your mouse! Also, each resource has links to further items that are available as PDF downloads or live links to other documents.

These resources are available in three areas - Education, Faith-Based, and Community / Professional. Many of us live in all three of these arenas, so all of these resources are available to every member of the guild. Michael Glasgow and Kathryn Aspenwall are partners in music ministry in North Carolina, but their expertise and wisdom are available to every guild member. Paul Weller may teach in Minnesota, but his articles about composition and improvisation are available to the entire membership.

Do you struggle with programming? Are you putting off your articles of incorporation? Can we help you develop a membership handbook? All of these resources and more are available to you on the guild's national website. It should be said that there is more that could be offered (and will be offered in the future), but you are hereby challenged to read all of the current resources before the end of the year.

Your guild website is also a clearinghouse for every member of Handbell Musicians of America. By logging in, you can see information about people from your hometown, and about people from Hong Kong. We are a global community of ringers, directors, composers, clinicians, and Handbell Musicians. Though you are thousands of miles apart, you are as close as a click of the mouse to every member of the guild.

Know that if you are lucky enough to work with a college handbell program, you can get a free on year membership for each of your ringers in the Handbell Musicians of America!

AGEHR Publishing is also represented on the guild's national website. There you can hear excellent recordings of guild published music, see PDF files of pieces, and even purchase and print downloadable music for your rehearsal tonight.

One thing that the guild would like to make available to every member is a Lifetime of Ringing. A member of a children's chime choir could be connected with a director of a Middle School handbell choir, then with a high school handbell choir, and possibly a church handbell program that includes high school-aged youth. This person then could find a college or university with a handbell program such as Wartburg College or Duke University and then locate a community handbell ensemble close to their first job, and even find a church or community handbell ensemble when a career move happened. Are you a handbell musician? If so, we want you. We need you. We want your arms, your fingers, your eyes, and your brain. We want your spirit, your soul, your energy, and your passion. Your guild's website is organized to help you find places to make the best music possible with the finest people available.

Finally, it should not be a surprise at this point that I am completely sold on the guild. You have my confidence and my word that Handbell Musicians of America is and will continue to be the primary voice for our artistic medium. I will do whatever I can as your Chair to make sure that Area 8 is at the forefront of that vision. We have the people, the resources, and the excitement necessary to make it happen here in Area 8. WHAT'S COMING UP IN ILLINOIS?

I'm excited to tell you about an entirely new format for our youth event on February 7, 2015—**Racing to Ring!** This event, in Naperville, IL, offers three tracks (based on age and skill), and you don't need to purchase and prepare any music. The racers (ringers) will attend classes on a variety of ringing topics, learn a processional during the day, and come together for a final sharing time that can include solo pieces by attending ensembles.

On February 21, 2015, we'll be offering a one-day workshop with The Agape Ringers in Cary, IL. The day begins with a massed sight-reading session with David Weck, and ringers then attend four classes. The classes cover topics of interest to beginning, intermediate and advanced ringers as well as directors. The day ends with a mini-concert by The Agape Ringers. Individuals are welcome; you don't have to come as a whole group. Here's what a past participant said about a previous workshop: "All four of us enjoyed the classes very much. We liked the group ring and are planning on ordering two of the pieces. We liked the camaraderie of being with other bell choirs. All of the instructors were very encouraging, enthusiastic, and well prepared. The mini concert at the end was an inspiring experience."


