
Member Resource Corner By Beth Ann Edwards

Learning to ring handbells can be overwhelming. So many things need to happen at once. Find your note on the page! Ring it at the right time! Watch the director! Damp! Ring the correct bell! Follow the dynamics! Turn the page! Sometimes isolating one or two of these items can build confidence and help a ringer move to the next level. One teaching tool I have used for rhythm and tempo is a set of rhythm flashcards available to members on the HMA website.

The National website is loaded with member resources. One of my favorites, Measure Mania: Rhythm Flashcard Games, can be accessed by following this path:

- Log in with your username and password or create an account (Have your member number handy.)
- Visit the Member Center

Members can download the flashcards in two sizes, and there are four levels of difficulty. I printed out the 8.5 x 11 size on cardstock, and a smaller sizer option is also available. An instruction sheet with nine game suggestions is downloadable.

Nebraska State Chair, Nancy Youngman

Nancy Youngman has been a handbell choir director since 1984, currently with 5 choirs in two churches under her direction, ages ranging from 5 to 94! She is the founder/director of Bell-issimo, Lincoln Nebraska's auditioned Community Handbell Choir.

Nancy has degrees in Instrumental Music and German, and recently retired from Lincoln Public Schools, where she taught both subjects for years.

Since 1990, Nancy has been a member of the Nebraska State Handbell Committee, and is currently serving the Guild as Area 8 Chimes Chair and Nebraska State Chair as well as serving previously as State Chair from 1994 – 1996 and Area 8 Secretary from 1996 – 1998, plus teaching at many Nebraska and Area 8 events.





Member Resource Corner...continued

The flashcards each have a unique rhythm for a measure equal to four quarter-notes. Feel free to use the cards as they might best suit your needs. I invented Game #10 and it works well for young ringers. Give each ringer a pair of rhythm sticks, or they can clap instead. When I hold up the flashcard, the ringers beat the rhythm with the sticks. If the card has four quarter-notes, they hit the sticks in rhythm four times. If there are two half-notes, they hit sticks on beats one and three. To keep the rhythm, they can also move the sticks outward (like windshield wipers) on beats two and four. If the ringers are new to reading music, I might click the rhythm once while they can view the card and have them click the rhythm back to me. When they have mastered the Level 1 rhythms, we can mix them up, put them in a sequence of four measures, or change the tempo. I can also pull out measures with rhythms that line up with a new piece of music I will introduce when the flash card game is completed.

When we move to the level where rests are introduced, the ringers continue to hit the sticks for the notes, and they hit the floor (or the bell table) for the rests. By using an action for the rests, they are introduced to the concept of damping, which requires an action to stop the sound of the handbell. This activity also teaches ringers to listen to each other and feel the pulse of the tempo. It might take a while before all the clicks and table taps happen at the same time, and if the learning process starts to slow down, I'm never above using bribes (I mean incentives), such as chocolate! Most of the ringers will be able to transfer this exercise to ringing bells and chimes, and periodic reinforcement will help them keep the beat!


