Super-Early Bird (or is it Super-Early-Bird or Super Early-Bird?) registration is \$230/person through March 15. Early-Bird fee of \$240/person applies March 16-April 15, and the regular registration fee is \$265/person starting April 16.

If your church, school, or other organization is not in a position to renew its membership at this time, consider an individual membership. The cost averages out to about \$8 per month. Membership information can be found HERE.





Area 8 Festival Scholarship Opportunity

Are you interested in attending the Area 8 Festival in Kansas City this summer, but have never had the chance before? Are you a Nebraska resident who either currently directs or rings in a handbell choir? If you can answer "yes" to those questions, you're eligible for the Mary Kettelhut Scholarship, which provides financial assistance to a person who has never attended an Area 8 Festival!

In 2018, we had two outstanding candidates who received the scholarship. Since then, they have both become members of the Nebraska State Board. Brian Lew, who directs in Lincoln, Nebraska, stated, "I attended my first Area 8 Handbell Festival with the generous support of the Mary Kettelhut Scholarship. This allowed me to attend workshops by world-renowned

clinicians and conductors, and enhanced my conducting and ringing abilities. An Area Festival will challenge what you do and do not know, and push you to be better."

Jonathan Rippe, who rings in Nebraska, also received a scholarship. Jonathan said, "The festival was a very wonderful experience and I

felt blessed to attend. I learned a great deal from the classes, concerts, and clinicians." He mentioned the Dreamweaving Class, where he even was able to help others learn the art of weaving. He admired the artistic ringing of Larry and Carla Sue. Jonathan also stated, "Throughout the conference, Tim Waugh had a profound impact on my bell ringing and taught me a lot of different ways to think about technique and expression. Some of my favorites were using T-Rex arms for quick ringing and getting into a fighting stance for the more aggressive parts of the music. The concept of warm and cold ringing changed the way that I thought about the sounds that can be produced by the bells and chimes."

These two were outstanding recipients, and we are looking for the next person. The scholarship pays the registration fee, as well as \$100 for transportation, lodging, food, or any other expense.

- 4. Handbell programs for youth
- 5. Working with any number of ringers
- 6. Recruiting and incorporating new members into an existing choir
